Students' application for an international mobility at VIVES University of Applied Sciences Kortrijk-Roeselare-Torhout-Brugge-Oostende is only possible by use of the <u>online application form</u> available on our website. The following documents must be enclosed and sent by airmail to International Office, together with the printed and signed online application form:

- Learning Agreement containing planned course units in our institution. The Learning Agreement may be modified after arrival and discussion with the academic coordinator. For all questions relating to Learning Agreement, please contact the faculty coordinator.
- Certificate of registration, together with 4 official passport photos, as mentioned on our website.

For staff mobility, the "Teaching assignment programme" or "working programme" form duly filled in and signed by home university should be sent to International Office.

#### PL BIALYST04

Local mentors will help incoming students with practical issues like opening a bank account, registration procedures etc.

Applicants with special needs will be contacted before the final approval of the acceptance. Final decision depends on extra services/ facilities available. Please contact International Programmes and Relations Office in order to get more information.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 5 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination or modification of the agreement

The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. The agreement will remain in effect until one party notifies the other of its wish to terminate. This should be done in writing, and a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In the event of such notice being given, all existing commitments to staff or students will be fulfilled. The agreement can be cancelled, activities can be added to it, and changes in mobility data can be made annually, provided they are communicated before January 1st.

Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
