- 1. Local mentors will help incoming students with practical issues like opening a bank account, registration procedures etc.
- 2. Not all of University buildings have the infrastructure to welcome students with disabilities. Please contact International Programmes and Relations Office in order to get more information. Applicants with special needs will be contacted before the final approval of the acceptance. Final decision depends on extra services/ facilities available.
- 3. If there are not enough students registered for the courses, the instructors usually do individual study with Erasmus+ students.
- 4. Application documents received after application deadlines will not be accepted.
- 5. Application form and Learning Agreement should be filled in English.

- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within six weeks.
- 3. **PL BIALYST04:** A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than **four weeks** after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 1) Academic Calendar:
- a) Fall (1st) Semester: Usually from 1st week of October to 1st week of February.
- b) Spring (2nd) Semester : Usually from 3rd week of February to 3rd week of June.
- Partner institution should send nominations to a.butarewicz@uwb.edu.pl specifying the name/s, field of study, academic year and semester, number of months, and e-mail address of the nominated student/s.

G KRITIS01: The receiving institution will send its decision/acceptance within 5 weeks after the application deadlines.

4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
